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#### CMS Releases Track 1+ ACO Model

Posted on 28 December 2016.

Move is designed to attract small physician practices and rural hospitals to new value-based payment models incorporating performance-based risk

The new track has more limited downside risk than Medicare Shared Savings Program (MSSP) Tracks 2 or 3. Its expected that 70,000 clinicians could qualify for Advanced Alternative Payment Model (APM) incentive payments in 2018 by participating in the MSSP Track 1+ ACO model.


## BACK TO THE FUTURE 1993
